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WHY IS READING IMPORTANT?

Unless a pupil can read, they cannot access learning to the full.

Fluent readers can learn more simply.

PHONICS EXPLAINED. Step 1 Decoding


Recognising a letter.

Say the sound it represents.

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Letter formation with a rhyme.

Pure sounds video clip




Grapheme = what does it look like? What letter do I write for the sound I want to use?




Grapheme and mnemonic	Picture card	Pronunciation phrase	Formation phrase
d d	duck	Put your tongue to the top and front of your mouth and make a quick d sound d d	Round the duck's body, up to its head and down to its feet.











If you have to sound out every word it is hard to remember what you read so understanding is impossible.

WHY DO THEY READ THE BOOKS SO OFTEN AT SCHOOL AND THEN STILL BRING THEM HOME?

Research suggests that you can comprehend a text comfortably when you know 98% of the words.

So...why is it 98%?
